



Makeup/Hair “gotta know....must have!!!! 2010-2011

- **Eyeglasses** - No eye glasses on stage unless it's part of your character; see a director immediately if there is an issue with this. Use contact lenses, please!
- **Foundation** - Basic foundation for girls/boys; match your own skin tone this year, or possibly one tone darker if you are fair skinned. Get cream-to-powder or powder. Trying to get away from liquids because it leaves too much of a line.
- **Blush** – lightly, if at all, and only girls; rose or pink color
- **Eye liner** – Black/brown eye liner; liquid pencil works best
 - **Boys** – no mascara
- **Eye shadow**
 - **Townsperson (girls)** – earthtones
 - **Ensemble 1** – TBD
 - **Step sisters/step mother** – TBD
- **Fake eyelashes** – ALL GIRLS will have fake eyelashes; girls only
- **Lipstick**
 - **Boys** – chapstick or gloss
 - **Girls** – pink to roses. NO Red
 - **Step sister/step mother** - TBD
- **Hair Products** – gel, mousse, spray needed to keep your hair out of your face. Bring your own comb, brush, hair curler, /straightener as needed
 - **Girls** – will be assigned
 - **Boys** – may be asked to cut or not cut their hair
- **Makeup sponges and applicators** – bring and use your own. No sharing!
- **Face wipes/makeup remover/handi-wipes** - for cleanup. You are not permitted to go to the bathrooms during the production. Also bring your own hand or stand-up table top mirror.

Also do not forget:

Laundry basket – you will need a laundry basket or similar Tupperware/Rubbermaid container. Put your name and role on it where it is visible. You will bring this to Olympia on the specified Saturday in February, not before!!!

Button Down shirt – you will need a large button down shirt to wear while applying makeup, and also while “hanging” backstage between scenes. This helps avoid any spilling, smearing on costumes

Aging – Some actors will need to be “aged.” We will provide you with the proper “graying” for your hair, and also for “wrinkles”....or you can practice getting old now!!!!

Jewelry – No jewelry is to be worn unless it is part of your character.

Underclothing – Think carefully about your choice of underwear/underclothes. No lines on stage...and no “stripping” back stage. Also, nothing should be so loose or so tight that you are caught pulling, adjusting, tugging, tucking in/out while on stage. It's distracting to the cast AND the audience!

- **Girls** – a one piece body suit allows for quick changes and is more comfortable over all
- **Boys** – briefs under your boxers, please.

The costumes are meant to match the character's personality, not yours.
You are a “character” and hopefully will not complain about what you have to wear.

Be careful or yes, you could be in tights!
